

## **District Evangelist Heynes will be new Apostle for United Kingdom and Ireland**

**District Evangelist David Heynes (52) will be ordained Apostle for all congregations in the United Kingdom and Ireland by Chief Apostle Jean-Luc Schneider on Easter Sunday 2018.**

“District Evangelist Heynes has many years of experience as a minister” states District Apostle Krause in his letter, which was read out to all congregations in the United Kingdom and Ireland. “Having a future Apostle based in the United Kingdom and Ireland will make it possible to provide much more intensive support for the ministers and congregations than has been possible up to now for the Apostles based in Germany” the letter continues.

### **District Evangelist David Heynes**

Already at the age of 21 David Heynes was ordained as a Sub-Deacon and 6 months later as a Deacon. One year later he became a Priest. In 1995 followed the ordination as an Evangelist. In 1997 David Heynes moved to Zürich with his family, where he acted as translator in the District Apostle meetings for 7 years and also as interpreter during various divine services. In 2004 he returned to the South of England. In 2010 he received the ministry of a District Evangelist and still serves in the South England district today.

After his ordination he will be working for the Church full-time. This will be a huge change for him, but he is looking forward to working with the Apostles and Bishops. Apostle Uli Falk has been looking after the United Kingdom and Ireland for approximately 7 years. Soon he will say farewell as he will be concentrating on his working area in Germany – but it goes without saying that he will gladly accompany David Heynes on occasion.

### **Chief Apostle Schneider in Nottingham**

The divine service with Chief Apostle Jean-Luc Schneider will take place on 1 April 2018 in Nottingham. There will be a satellite transmission to all congregations (with the appropriate transmission technology) of the New Apostolic Church North and East Germany.
