A celebration of the life of our late retired Priest Dennis Glazier. 21st March 1935 - 22nd January 2022.

Dennis met his first wife, Ann, in 1956 and they married 21st March 1959. Ann sadly passed away on 7th April 1975. They had one son, Barry, born 10th January 1967.

Dennis and Ann were introduced to our New Apostolic faith in 1966 through an invitation Ann received from a colleague at work. The following Sunday they so enjoyed the divine service and fellowship that they remained and got involved.

In the summer of 1975, Dennis met Helga and they married on 24th July 1976.

Dennis served as a deacon from April 1967, and as priest from 1970, firstly in our Swindon congregation and then in Ti-

verton, where he moved to in 1978. One of the reasons for moving was the vast number of holiday makers that wanted to attend service in the region. For quite some time, Dennis and Helga opened their home where services could be held.

Even after retirement in 2001, Dennis once again, agreed to serve as a priest for a further two years, this was a great blessing and joy to the congregation.

The following words of the Psalmist so aptly apply to Dennis.

'One thing I have desired of the Lord, That will I seek: That I may dwell in the house of the Lord All the days of my life, To behold the beauty of the Lord.' ■

War in Europe

Aid for Ukraine

Some of our brethren have asked for information on how they can best provide support to Ukraine. The article below provides information from NAK-Karitativ, a New Apostolic Church affiliated aid organisation based in Germany.

UKRAINE: AID MEASURES ARE UNDERWAY

NAK-karitativ cooperates with a long-standing partner organisation 'Help' and the local Ukrainian aid organisation Vostok SOS to alleviate the greatest need of the people in the crisis areas.

We are cooperating with our long-standing partner organisation, Help - Hilfe zur Selbsthilfe and Vostok SOS, a local Ukrainian aid organisation, both of which have provided initial relief measures for the people who have been affected. The emergency aid is initially focused on Western Ukraine, where hundreds of

thousands of people are currently fleeing. Our local partner has teams already on the ground to assess immediate needs and to provide the people seeking protection with essential basic food, water, hygiene, utensils, and medical items, as well as winter clothing.

Emergency aid packages are being provided to people who cannot flee the crisis areas due to their age or illness. In addition, families are being provided with financial aid for transport or evacuation. Our local partner also provides up-to-date information on available evacuation centres, safe accommodation and sleeping facilities and other protective measures to enable people to flee safely. Psychological support is offered to those who are severely traumatised.

Ukraine urgently needs our support. Please help us to make a new beginning as easy as possible for them.

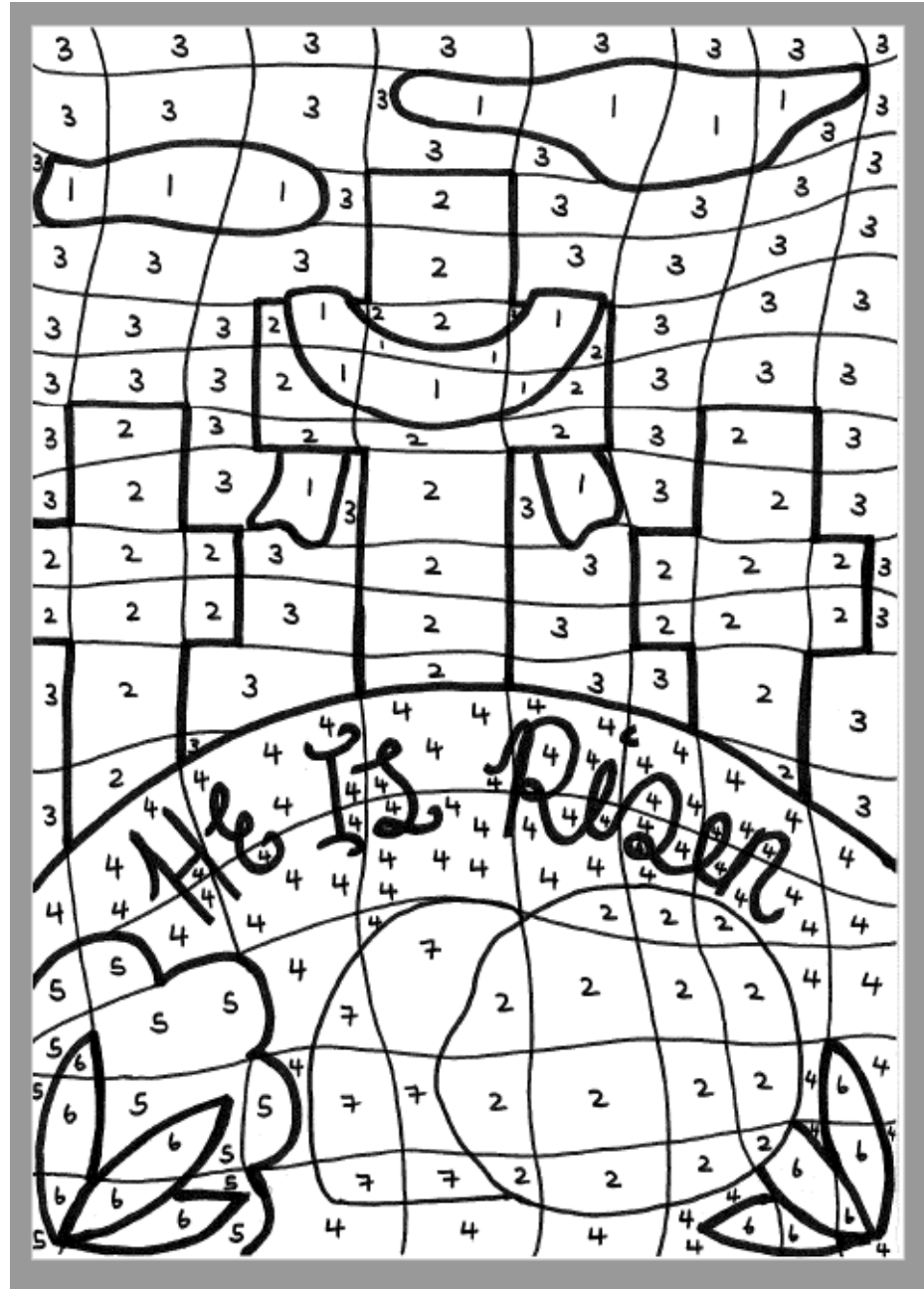

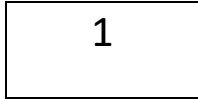
