The Presence of His Love - Faith Alive sings for Charity

The October half-term weekend 2023 saw our first ever Faith Alive Residency project. 19 singers and musicians from all over the country came together and enjoyed a weekend of singing, practicing, vocal coaching, and instrumental music - and of course lots and lots of fellowship, fun, laughter, and experiences. With professional conductor and vocal coach Claudia Zohm as our special guest (especially flown in from Weimar, Germany for our weekend!), we created a complete, hour-long choir programme in just two days of practicing. The music ranged from baroque instrumental pieces on recorders, flutes, and strings, to romantic and contemporary choir music by Gounod, Bairstow and Rutter, plus spiritual and gospel music, including a world premiere of a new piece by our Sister Namiye Sianga (Manchester Congregation).

The weekend was rounded off by two benefit concerts in aid of the local foodbanks in our church in Camberley, and in Christ Church, Swindon. The concerts under the title '*The Presence of His Love*,' took the audiences on a journey from loneliness and longing into God's house, and through an experience of God's love eventually to grace, praise and blessing.

Both concerts also provided an opportunity for the chairs of the charities, the BESOM at Camberley and the Swindon Food Collective, to speak about the escalating challenge of supporting people and families in poverty and need. They reported that the foodbanks have seen a 50%+ rise in the number of people requiring support, an effect of the difficult economic situation many families see themselves in. The concerts raised over £300 for the charities, which was greatly welcomed; and audiences praised the sense of upliftment from the music, and the warmth of faith expressed. It was a hugely rewarding experience.

A couple of weeks later, we were also privileged to repeat some of our concert

Finland Youth Weekend

Spending pleasant moments in faith under the theme of JESUS LOVES YOU was a key ambition of the youth in 2023. The aim of this event was to remind young people that Jesus Christ loves them.

From 27th – 29th October 2023, a great New Apostolic youth event took place in Vaasa, one of the cities in Finland located on the west coast.

They started to arrive from all over Finland at around 1pm. Some of the young people from the New Apostolic church had invited their friends, and it was great to be able to share the love that unites us as the children of God with other people.

The youth were escorted in cars to the Valonia hotel and others took the public bus. When they arrived at the hotel, they were given their respective room keys to leave their luggage and rest. After everyone had finished resting, the youth leader, Pr. Clement Tshisungu asked all the young people to gather in the meeting room and gave the guidelines to be followed during their stay at the hotel. The meeting began with an opening prayer by the priest, assisted by our three deacons.

After the presentations from young people from different towns: Jyväskylä, Kemi, Kokkola, Klaukkala, Mikkeli, Turku and Nykarleby were completed, the guests asked questions about the New Apostolic faith, for example, the baptism with water and the Holy Spirit and what the purpose of the church was.

'What can one do to be a faithful member of the New Apostolic Church?'

'All you have to do is accept Jesus Christ as your only Lord and Saviour of your soul and be baptised by water and the Spirit.'

After the meeting ended, the young people had some free time to get to know their guests, and to discuss their communities and activities within the church.

In the refectory, you could see the joy, happiness, and hope on the faces of the youth. It was a wonderful moment.

They wore T-shirts which sent out a strong message to the public who were there and who were keen to understand this joy. There was a kind of celestial pride that the young people managed to convey to the public and the love of God. The love of God could be felt everywhere.

The youth set off to the place of activities, full of anticipation. Once there, the programme was presented to the young people, and you had to see the expression on their faces to know that they were going to have fun.

The sports events included among other things, football between girls and boys and group football, egg race, jumping in bags on two feet, and a race between Sunday school /confirmation teachers.

Once the first part of the activities had finished, the youth headed to where the

food was served by their mothers. The young people ate, and it was an incredible and wonderful moment.

The second part started at 2pm and there were poems to be presented by communities, song competitions, bible race, bible quiz, sketch and eating competition. After completing all the activities, the young people rehearsed for 2 hours and then had time to rest. Then it was time for supper.

Sunday was a special day. After the breakfast in the early hours, the youth prepared for the divine service. The deacons arranged the room where the service would take place and already at 9 am the young choristers were in the church rehearsing.

The divine service was led by Priest Clement Tshisungu under the theme 'Jesus loves you,' Mathew:19:21.

Priest Clement explained the young people how often it is beneficial to work for the Eternal Father, that we must leave our wealth (the carnal desire, which pushes us to sin) behind. He strengthened the young people to take the decision now; not tomorrow, but today to work for God. And he called on the deacons to assist and encourage the youth to remain faithful.

After the divine service, they sang hymns, chatted, and thanked God for the incredible experience they had. It was a real blessing from God.

Vacancy for a volunteer role of a Trustee

Description of role

The New Apostolic Church UK is seeking a volunteer trustee to help lead the charity and decide how it is run.

The charity is managed by a board of trustees, which include the District Apostle and Apostle as well as volunteer trustees known as Nominated Trustees.

The role of the trustees includes but is not limited to:

- Supporting the charity to achieve its purpose to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the worldwide teachings of the New Apostolic Church
- Complying with the charity's governing document.
- Acting in the charity's best interests
- Managing the charity resources responsibly.
- Acting with reasonable care and skill
- Attending trustee meetings these are held a minimum of twice per year.

Skills and qualities needed for the role:

- Fully committed and active New Apostolic Christian
- Able to dedicate approximately one hour per week plus two meetings per year to engage in the duties of a trustee.
- Most meetings are held online, however, if travel is required then travel expenses will be paid.
- Experience in teaching, property management marketing or finance would be an advantage, however, we would welcome applications from anyone who thinks they would be a good trustee. Previous board experience is not necessary. We value objectivity, openness, and commitment.
