Introduction

Interview with Christal Schneider.

Each quarter in 2024, we will feature one of our musicians from across the UK, Ireland, and the Isle of Man. Music enhances our experience of the divine service, by encouraging, inspiring, and sustaining us. And for those performing, it is a pleasure and a responsibility to bring that joy to the congregation.

Christal Schneider is a gifted soprano and organist. She is based in our Chelsfield congregation and is our orchestra group secretary and NAC music ambassador. Christal shares what makes her tick music wise.

What do you work as? I'm working full time as executive assistant supporting four managing directors with their diary, expenses, and day to day meetings, I've been doing that 11 years.

I love organising and getting things done, you might even say I like being bossy!

What or who inspired you to sing and learn to play the organ and recorder? In terms of singing, my family is quite blessed, it starts with my great grandparents, and their talent was passed down through the generations. I looked to them for inspiration and as an example – they sang out of love and that encouraged us kids to follow and do our bit.

I taught myself the organ – my mum could play too – there were two pieces out of the old blue hymnal: 'What joy tis redeemed to be', and, 'I praise God's love in adoration'. Both were free from any sharps or flats and I could follow them.

Mum wrote the notes in pencil above the melody, and I learned with one finger, then I added the alto bass and tenor. As I got more confident – I then chose another piece and just built up for there, I did that for a couple of years. Mum and dad got me a music teacher and I went for lessons once a week. I told the teacher I wanted to learn the music from our church hymnal. So, she patiently taught me the music; the theory book she wrote her notes in is so sentimental to me that I still have it!

When I want to do something, I can be quite determined, and I did that for two or three years.

However, the area we lived in didn't have many teachers so from then on, I just practiced and worked at home.

After my Confirmation I was asked if I wanted to play the organ at church. It was nerve wracking!

However, my grandparents had come to that first service, and I felt very proud and blessed and I just kept going. I am passionate about music and that is what keeps me motivated.

To improve my technique, I listened to others and really tried to get things right. It helps when watching and listening to what other experienced organists do, you just can't go wrong when following that.

How often do you practice? I do now and then – and I do try and master pieces, sometimes after church I do tinkle with a few pieces. I play most weeks at church and that helps me.

What kind of music do you like?
I like a bit of everything – from Nat
King Cole and pop to classical, gospel
and jazz.

Any favourite hymn? Tough question! So I'll go with a few pieces, I love 'Miracle of Love', and moving away from hymns I also love George Ezra's 'Budapest,' and Meghan Trainer, 'All the about that Bass,' which is a great pick me up piece! And of course, any song by ABBA!

What would you say to anyone thinking about taking music
lessons? I'd say to anyone wanting to learn music or play an instrument, go for it! It takes a lot of practice, hard work and dedication but is very rewarding. Music has certainly enriched my life over the years and continues to do so.
